



Reporting Guide

This guide provides information about the SME Climate Hub reporting requirements, the process for reporting through the [SME Climate Hub](#), and the [SME Reporting Tool](#).

What are the SME Climate Hub reporting requirements?

Reporting is required annually for SMEs after they make the [SME Climate Commitment](#).

To facilitate reporting requirements, SMEs can use the free [SME Reporting Tool](#). The tool helps complete a report summary, which is submitted to the SME Climate Hub and can be shared with various stakeholders.

MANDATORY INFORMATION

The [SME Reporting Tool](#) contains mandatory questions, in line with SME Climate Hub requirements, which are anchored in UN High Level Champions Race to Zero [starting line criteria](#). It is mandatory to:

- Provide general company information
- Comment on your company's climate targets
- Report own emissions – Scope 1 & 2 Comment on plan and actions to reduce own and value chain emissions

OPTIONAL INFORMATION

The [SME Reporting Tool](#) also includes highly recommended but non-mandatory questions, which provide an opportunity to report on the company's overall climate strategy and progress. Non-mandatory questions include:

- Quantification of value chain emissions
- Management and strategy
- Climate solutions (solutions which enable the business's customers to avoid or remove emissions)

SMEs can also upload their own sustainability reports, confirming that they have provided a report which is publicly available and fulfills the requirements. See the SME Climate Hub [Rules for SME Climate Reporting](#) for further details.

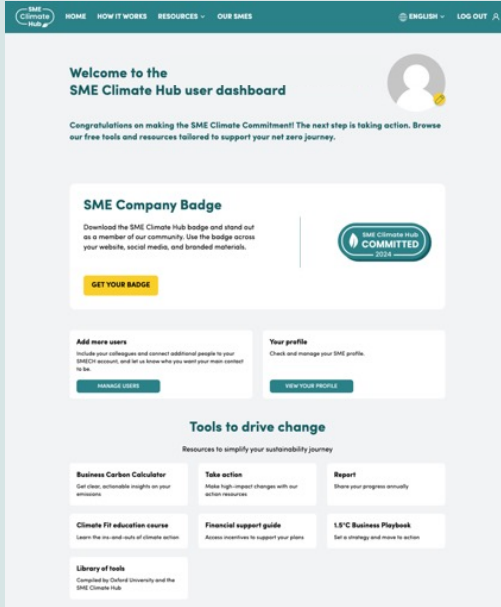
What is the process for reporting through SME Climate Hub?

SMEs need to provide their first progress report within 12 months of making the [SME Climate Commitment](#). The SME Climate Hub has an annual reporting deadline of October 1st. SMEs can find their next reporting deadline in their user dashboard or in the [SME Reporting Tool](#).

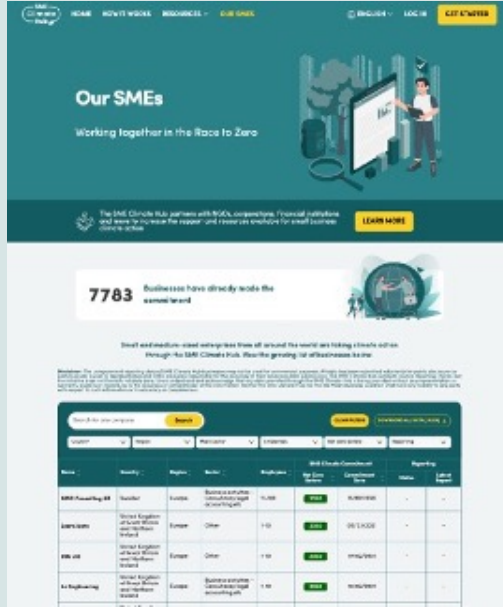
If an SME needs more time to complete their report, they can request a 6-month extension. This gives them until April 1st of the following year to submit. SMEs can request the extension through their user dashboards or in the [SME Reporting Tool](#).

If the company reports through the [SME Reporting Tool](#), the SME Climate Hub will automatically check that the mandatory data has been provided. SMEs are responsible for the quality of their own data.^[1]

Once the report is submitted:



SMEs can access their full report and data through their SME Climate Hub dashboard.



The data provided is made public through the SME Climate Hub website on the [Our SMEs](#) page.^[2]

^[1] The SME Climate Hub does not take responsibility for reviewing the content in the reports but will select sample reports to review at a high level, including reports produced through the SME Climate Hub reporting tool and other public reports submitted. These reviews are for internal quality control only and will not constitute external review or verification.

What is the SME Reporting Tool?

The [SME Reporting Tool](#) is provided as a free resource to enable SMEs to create a climate report summarizing their annual greenhouse gas emissions, including the actions they are taking to meet their targets and the impact of their emissions reduction efforts.



The [SME Reporting Tool](#) is available for use by all SMEs regardless of commitment status.

The tool is designed specifically for SMEs. The downloadable report produced and the data included can be integrated into annual business reports, shared on company websites, or directly distributed to customers and funders and can be used for year-on-year comparison of emissions.

The first reporting tool in 2023 was based on a simplified [SME Climate Disclosure Framework](#) that was developed in partnership with CDP, the Exponential Roadmap Initiative, and Normative.

The updated [SME Reporting Tool](#) was released in 2024. This version of the tool is an evolution of the first reporting tool that builds on learnings from the first rounds of reporting, incorporates SME and stakeholder feedback, aligns with evolving legislation and standards (ex. CSRD and CDP), and makes available a more simplified reporting tool for micro-SMEs.
